

SPECIAL NOTICE TO ALL MCA MEMBERS LEGAL NOTICE OF ELECTION

- I. Candidate Eligibility: A slate of candidates, all of whom are members in good standing of the Meadview Civic Association, shall be selected by a nominating committee. The consent of all candidates shall be obtained before placing their names on the ballot. At the annual meeting a member present may nominate a member for the Board of Governors. No write-in candidates shall be accepted unless nominated at the annual meeting. No member nominated at the annual meeting shall be considered unless the candidate consents to serve if elected. The presiding officer (1) minute each.
- II. Who May Vote: Only members in good standing will be eligible to vote. To be a member in good standing that all association assessments on lots being voted, have been paid in full by 2 P.M., THE FRIDAY PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING.
- III. Voting Eligibility: A person eligible to vote in this election must be the owner or co-owner of Meadview property which is presently being assessed by the Association.

One vote only may be cast for each lot so assessed. Where a lot or lots are owned by one or more persons, only one of the persons names as co-owner may vote for any one lot. Only one vote per lot is allowed. You mav vote by absentee ballot if unable to attend the meeting. You must request your absentee ballot from the Secretary of the Board. Carefully follow the instructions sent with your ballot(s) and return to the Secretary. ABSENTEE BALLOTS MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE SECRETARY OF THE ASSOCI-ATION BY THE CLOSE OF THE LAST BUSINESS DAY PRI- IX. Voting by Absentee Ballot: Members can request OR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING.

IV. Verification of Voting Eligibility: Each prospective voter will be required to present proper identification prior to receiving the ballot (s) for voting. Association records will be checked to verify that such person is a member in good standing. Each prospective voter will then be given the specific number of ballots, one for each member lot, and will then cast his/ her ballot(s) immediately after verification. Voting hours shall be from the conclusion of the annual meeting to

2:00 p.m. There shall be no electioneering within one hundred (100) yards of the polling place.

- V. Ballots for Voting: Subsequent to verification of eligibility to vote, members will be given one (1) ballot for each lot for which he/she is authorized to cast a vote. Members, after verification of eligibility to vote, and receiving the ballot(s) shall proceed to vote and deposit said ballot(s) in the ballot box within ten (10) minutes. A member voting for more than ten (10) ballots shall have multiples of ten (10) minutes for each ten (10) ballots being voted.
- VI. Voting Procedures: A. In accordance with the desires of the majority of the Association members as expressed at the May 28, 1988 meeting

and at the prerogative of the present Board of Governors as authorized in Article III, Section I of the By-Laws of the Association, the number of persons to sit on the Board of Governors shall be seven (7). **B.** Place an "X" in the box beside the name of each candidate you wish to vote for. On all propositions, place an "X" in the appropriate box. On all proposed By-Laws changes mark an "X" in the appropriate box.

C. Fold your ballot and deposit in the ballot box provided. NOTE: Voting for more candidates than seats available will invalidate the ballot.

In accordance with Article III of the Association By-Laws, the Board members will be elect executive officers from their owns ranks. The executive officers of the Association shall be President, Vice-President, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer.

C. This Board of Governors shall manage and control the business affairs of the Association in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Articles of Incorporation and the By-Laws of the Association.

Absentee Ballots received after THE FRIDAY PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING mail pick -up, will be invalid.

Upon receipt the sealed envelope with the absentee ballot showing the Bar Code of the voter shall be logged in and placed in a locked ballot box. On election Day, the Election Committee will remove the ballot from the envelope for counting purposes.




If you were one of those on hand at South Cove on March 25th, you were perhaps handed an innocent looking map of Lake Mead, encompassing the area from Gregg's Basin to Boundry Point. Scanning the shoreline on the map for familiar points...South Cove, Sandy Point, Iceberg Canyon, Iceberg Reef, Driftwood Cove, these make sense. But what are all the rest of these names...Treasure Island, Salty Dog Cove, Double Cross Cove, Shipwreckers Bay, Rattlesnake Reef. What happened to the shoreline? Across the lake are more and more crazy names for bays, coves and islands, all strange and weird such as Itsy Bitsy Island, Bahama Beach, Bengal Bay, Raindrop Cove. "Pah! Someone is trying to cross it up," you say, & boy, you are right. You see, on March 25th, s Treasure Hunt to the end all Treasure Hunts was held, but with a difference. Instead of walking or using cars to take you from point to point, hunting out the clues, the method of transportation on this hunt was by boat & the place was Lake Mead. Here's how this event works. The map you have before you is a Treasure Map, conceived and printed with all these crazy names to throw you & your crew off course. Each contesting boat & crew is given, at the start of the hunt, a clue. This clue tells how to find the next clue hidden somewhere on the shore. By consulting the map & applying clues, you are on your way to real fun outing. Now for kicks, let's take the first 2 teasers, they were written in rhyme. "The first is the simplest you're gonna get... just convert these numbers into the alphabet." 19-5-1-7-21-12 9-19-12-1-14-4. Got it? Seagull Island. After reaching Seagul Island you find your clue #2 which goes like this: "A big fat bird with a bill so odd, if you're on the right track he will give you a nod.
