We need help to recruit new members and, by working with our board, you could help create a membership drive event or other event specific to membership recruitment. 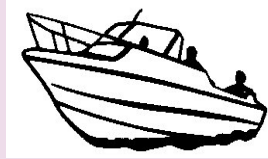

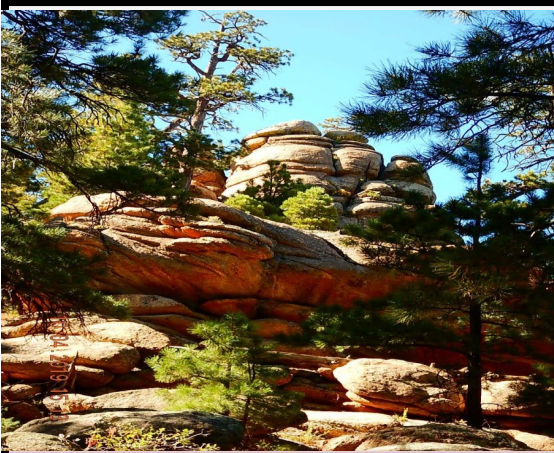

In August of 1970, the owners of the Meadview subdivision determined that to maintain the friendly small town attraction of Meadview, a central meeting & recreational facility was needed. They set up the MCA with involuntary membership to property owners. A number of Meadview families agreed and the Articles of Incorporation were created and accepted by the State of Arizona. With an \$80,000 loan to erect the facility, construction of the lounge, kitchen and pool began January of 1971 and completed in July that same year.*
