District). Chief DeMaio announced Ellen Reh-Bower will be resigning after serving for 10 ¹/₂ vears as LMRFD Administrative Office Manager. Nancy Scott is in training to fill this job. Chief DeMaio is working on a contract with the State Forester and the Homeland Security grant is ongoing. LMRFD will participate in a County wide Emergency Management bus crash training session time in Meadview's station #43. He is hoping that soon he will be able to guarantee full time coverage for Meadview.

A call to the public included a question on

how much does the new ambulance cost? Flynn

answered \$180,000 if new. He is looking at

moving a 'box' from one we currently have to a new cab and chassis. Chief's truck? Flynn answered that depends on what is purchased, \$ 18,000 would be low. Another question was, "How does LMRFD collect debts of Margo Barragan (928-336,000?" Flynn answered that most of this debt is due to assignment contracted Medicare from and AHCCCS and there is no way to collect this. Ambulance rates are based on what Arizona DHS allows. It is good to know our fire district is in good local hands and as Meadview and Dolan grow this district will

continue to grow.

The end of April balance sheet showed the district had a quarter million and depending on the cost of some repair t o o u r

ambulance we should end the fiscal year in good shape. John Flynn, appointed Administrator for the past 2 ¹/₂ years, adopted the tentative budget for 2016/2017. This will be voted upon by the newly elected Board of Directors on June 22nd. The budget is \$906,011. The new board was elected on May 17th and consists of David Anthony, Steve Berg, Deborah Cass, Charlotte Kiffer and Eric Terrill.

Flynn stated that a line of credit for the coming fiscal year has been established at National Bank of Arizona. He also approved a IGA (International Assistance) with NACFD (Northern Arizona Consolidated Fire

REVIEW OF COM MEETINGS APRIL/ MAY

The April meeting had 58 in the audience who enjoyed the slide show provided by Amanda Coffman, a member of the Mohave Sheriff's

Search and Rescue group. She gave us a very short history of why this group is so very important to our area. They have over 100 members and have recently been called upon to rescue a rock climber who got up on the pinnacles north of Dolan, but fell as he started back down. S'n'R personnel climbed up and secured him and then helped him to a spot where the S'n'R helicopter could pick him up to

be airlifted to the hospital. Our second speaker was Fire Chief Tony DeMaio, who discussed the problems facing the candidates who will be elected in May to be seated on the LMRFD Board of Directors. DeMaio has worked 20 years as a paramedic/firefighter and is very familiar with the Meadview area.



The May audience of 80 were introduced to five of the seven running for the LMRFD Board of Directors, each candidate gave a short

bio of their qualifications for the job. Fire Chief Tony DeMaio discussed the purchase of Care Flight by Air Methods and mentioned that the company would be offering helicopter insurance plans to offset what Medicare will pay and what you, as a patient, must pay. Mackie Faulkengren updated us on a situation of the tourist helicopter noise over Unit 4. After many phone calls she was able to locate the tourist company as Serenity of Boulder City.



Our September 1st meeting will have as our main speaker someone from the Kingman Red Cross. They will fill us in on

what their disaster team can offer to us if and when we would have any type of disaster in our area. Flooding, high winds, tornados, range fires, hazardous material spills, etc., to name a few of the situations the Red Cross deals with. The Friends of the Arizona Joshua Tree Forest will present a power point program in October; in November Liz Buckingham will do a detailed program on the many Veteran Benefits that she can put you in touch with. Once again the 17 mile scenic trip across the Big Sandy had to be cancelled at the last minute. We hope the 3rd time will be a charm. We visited the hills around what was the Golden Mile Mine, off Gregg's Hideout Road, then the group hiked up the North Monolith and ate lunch. The clouds and wind kept some hikers from going to the Dry Falls, but Vern and Char Farris made it and beat the rain. Seven cars drove up to the Rampart Overlook (Meadview's View). We also drove to the New Water Spring area and then climbed into the caves just before you reach the New Water Spring area. Most of

us were surprised at how good the road to the Overlook is, and we were really surprised to see how much Meadview has expanded in the last two years. The plan is to hike some of the trails on Hualapai Mountain, east of Kingman, on June 17 to have our annual Sandy Point picnic and swim. 

Friends of the Arizona Joshua Tree Forest are very happy to announce that the Forest is going to be the subject of a documentary. On May 29th a Videographer spent 2:00 p.m. almost an entire day filming, using hand held cameras and drone filming to obtain both land and sky perspectives. Time lapse shots were incorporated into this project, with plenty of Joshua Trees as well as some animals included. This project is funded by a grant from the Conservation Lands Foundation and a final version will be a 10-15 minute video with music and voice over. The Friends of the AZ Joshua Tree Forest Group will use this documentary in presentations to conservation groups, political and business leaders and community groups. The purpose is to spread the word and gather support for our Group's efforts to preserve and protect our magnificent forest.

We will present the final version at a future public meeting here in Meadview, which we hope all our friends and neighbors will attend. We will also provide a link to this documentary on our website when available.

Payment Options:

Bill Pay through your bank. Automatic payment sent by the member from their bank account and a check will be made out and mailed to the MCA from your bank.
