Special Notice to ALL MCA Members Legal Notice of Election

- I. Candidate Eligibility:** A slate of candidates, all of whom are members in good standing of the Meadview Civic Association, shall be selected by a nominating committee. The consent of all candidates shall be obtained before placing their names on the ballot. At the annual meeting a member present may nominate a member for the Board of Governors. No write-in candidates shall be accepted unless nominated at the annual meeting. No member nominated at the annual meeting shall be considered unless the candidate consents to serve if elected. The presiding officer shall limit nominating speeches from the to one (1) minute each.
- II. Who May Vote:** Only members in good standing will be eligible to vote. To be a member in good standing that all association assessments on lots being voted, have been paid in full by **2 P.M., THE FRIDAY PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING.**
- III. Voting Eligibility:** A person eligible to vote in this election must be the owner or co-owner of Meadview property which is presently being assessed by the Association.
One vote only may be cast for each lot so assessed. Where a lot or lots are owned by one or more persons, only one of the persons names as co-owner may vote for any one lot. Only one vote per lot is allowed.
You may vote by absentee ballot if unable to attend the meeting. You must request your absentee ballot from the Secretary of the Board. Carefully follow the instructions sent with your ballot(s) and return to the Secretary. **ABSENTEE BALLOTS MUST BE BY THE SECRETARY OF THE ASSOCIATION RECEIVED BY THE CLOSE OF THE LAST BUSINESS DAY PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING.**
- IV. Verification of Voting Eligibility:** Each prospective voter will be required to present proper identification prior to receiving the ballot(s) for voting. Association records will be checked to verify that such person is a member in good standing. Each prospective voter will then be given the specific number of ballots, one for each member lot, and will then cast his/her ballot(s) immediately after verification.
Voting hours shall be from the conclusion of the annual meeting to 2:00 p.m.
There shall be no electioneering within one hundred (100) yards of the polling place.
- V. Ballots for Voting:** Subsequent to verification of eligibility to vote, members will be given one (1) ballot for each lot for which he/she is authorized to cast a vote. Members, after verification of eligibility to vote, and receiving the ballot(s) shall proceed to vote and deposit said ballot(s) in the ballot box within ten (10) minutes. A member voting for more than ten (10) ballots shall have multiples of ten (10) minutes for each ten (10) ballots being voted.
- VI. Voting Procedures:** A. In accordance with the desires of the majority of the Association members as expressed at the May 28, 1988 meeting and at the prerogative of the present Board of Governors as authorized in Article III, Section I of the By-Laws of the Association, the number of persons to sit on the Board of Governors shall be seven (7).
B. Place an "X" in the box beside the name of each candidate you wish to vote for. On all propositions, place an "X" in the appropriate box. On all proposed By-Laws changes mark an "X" in the appropriate box.
C. Fold your ballot and deposit in the ballot box provided. NOTE: Voting for more candidates than seats available will invalidate the ballot.
- VII. Ballot Counting:** A. After all the ballots have been cast, the Election Committee will open the ballot box and proceed to count and record the votes.
B. To verify proper performance in all aspects of the election, the election will be monitored by appointed Association members.
- VIII. Installation of Officers:** A. Immediately after the determination of names of the winning candidates, the newly elected members will assume their positions on the Board.
B. In accordance with Article III of the Association By-Laws, the Board members will be elect executive officers from their owns ranks. The executive officers of the Association shall be President, Vice-President, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer.
C. This Board of Governors shall manage and control the business affairs of the Association in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Articles of Incorporation and the By-Laws of the Association.
- IX. Voting by Absentee Ballot:** Members can request an absentee ballot, one for each lot on which an assessment is paid, which will list the slate of candidate dates, Propositions, and the proposed By-Law changes. The request form for absentee ballots should be filled in and mailed to:

Upon receipt of the request form, eligibility and number of votes entitled to be cast will be determined. The ballot(s) will be mailed to the requester with a return envelope addressed to the Secretary of the Board. After indicating your choice of candidates and By-Law changes, seal the ballot(s) in the envelope addressed to the Secretary. Walk-in Absentee ballots will be accepted until, **2 P.M., THE FRIDAY PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING.** Absentee Ballots received after **THE FRIDAY PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING** mail pick-up, will be invalid.
Upon receipt the sealed envelope with the absentee ballot showing the Bar Code of the voter shall be logged in and placed in a locked ballot box. On election Day, the Election Committee will remove the ballot from the envelope for counting purposes.

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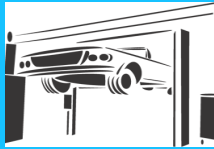

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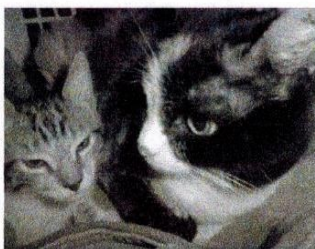

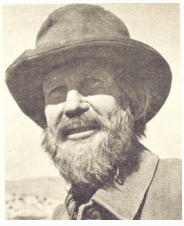

BLAST FROM THE PAST

Fabulous Folks

From Meadview Monitor April, May, June 1968



Recently, the Meadview gang had the pleasure of talking to Jimmie Jordan, “the-man-who’s-done-it-all.”

Jimmie and his wife of Boulder City, Nevada spent the day at

Meadview. This gave us a perfect chance to get Jimmie to tell us about the days when he barged guano down the Colorado River.

This is the story Jimmie told us, quote:

“The bat cave was first discovered and explored in the 1930’s by the hardy river-runners. It is located 800 ft. above the river, in the face of a cliff, in the Lower Granite Gorge of the Grand Canyon. Being a river-runner, I had the opportunity to explore the cave and take part in some of the first mining operations.

I had the privilege of assisting a geologist with getting samples of the guano, to be analyzed. The entire length of the cave probably will never be explored. I have been back in the cave about 1300 ft. In places the guano was so deep and soft that we couldn’t get through it. And then in several places the cave had 100 ft. ceilings. Due to possible cave-ins we were cautious about going further. It had been estimated that there was 100,000 tons of dry, brownish guano available and would bring 10 Million dollars when marketed.

We took the guano samples to Phoenix to be analyzed. The analysis proved, that because of the thousands of years during period when the Southwest’s climate was more favorable and insect food was plentiful, the guano was one of the best ever fertilizer it also contained a pharmaceutical raw material.

I started barging the guano down the river about 1946 for Walter Swartz who was operating the mine at the times. The guano shoveled into a four inch pipe which was connected to a vacuum pump. The suction pump pulled the guano to a storage bin, stationed on the river bank 800 ft. below. The guano was then sacked and made ready for transportation.

The barge that I had was 8 ft. wide and 30 ft. long. I loaded it with 60 tons of guano (every trip). My 36 ft. Cruiser, which had twin diesel motors, pulled the loaded barge at 5 miles per hour. It took a day and a half to go from the mine to Hemingway Wash Marina. (The Marina was and still is located about two miles above Boulder Dam on the Nevada side of Lake Mead).

The guano was loaded into trucks and taken to Henderson, Nevada where it was warehoused and made ready for shipment to market.

Mr. Swartz decided to add more barges to the operation and more tonnage to each barge. Four barges sunk with 100 tons each which was a great financial loss for the company. New owners took over the operation of the mine and I became an innocent by-stander.

It was decided by the new owners that flying the guano out of the canyon was the solution to the transportation problem. A landing field was built on a sand bar across the river from the guano mine. Flying the guano out proved to be as unsuccessful as barging it.

It was time that the U.S. Guano Corporation of Toronto, Canada decided to build the spectacular tramway to lift the guano from the depths of the Colorado river.

The tramway, built to extract the estimated 10 million dollars of bat guano, cost one half million dollars. The huge steel structures over look the Colorado River from the vantage point of 3,569ft. The cable, spanning the river, was connected to the other side of the cliff at the bat cave. It had horizontal span of 7500ft. At the time it was claimed to be the longest single span tramway in this country, perhaps the world.

The tram bucket, which was a aluminum cargo bucket, held 3500lbs of guano. A round trip, to loading bin at the cave location and back to storage bin on the South Rim, took about 20 min. For a normal working day there was 20 to 25 trips.

The tramway operation of mining the guano proved to be very successful but was put to an end when a low flying jet plane severed the spanning cable.

Since that the time the machinery has all been removed from the mine. The severed cable lays cradled in the arms of the giant cliffs, while the steel structures stand as sentinels to an exciting past.

We were all engrossed by Jimmie’s story of the guano mine, so we urged him to tell us more about his past experiences.

Jimmie, who is an authority on river-running, especially the Colorado River, told us about his hair raising experiences of being the first to bring a boat powered by an outboard motor through the Grand Canyon.

In 1959 he had the pleasure of working with the Walt Disney Film Studios. He was the guide for the crew who were

filming the movie called “The Ten Who Dared”. This is a story of Major John Wesley Powell’s trip down the Colorado River in 1869. Jimmie had a part in the movie. He was cast as a boatman, going through “all” the rapids.

In 1964 the National Science Foundation in Washington D.C. Commissioned Jimmie to test 2 black aluminum boats on Lake Mead. The boats were built by Smithcraft in Phoenix, AZ for an experiment in the Antarctica (the study of penguins, seals and other wild life in the Antarctic region).

More stories were told and to our great surprise, we found out that Jimmie was not only an authority on Colorado River expeditions, the first person to bring the boat through the Grand Canyon powered by an outboard motor, one of the first to transport guano from the Guano Cave, test pilot for National Science Foundation, but he was also was an airline pilot, raced autos, motorcycles and boats.

He took up outboard boat racing in the middle twenties. He was known all over the country as “Rattlesnake Jordan”. His first racing outboard was a big four cylinder Evinrude. He teamed up with Seth Smith of the Smithcraft Boat Company. Seth built the all metal hydroplanes and Jimmie raced them.

In 1930 Jimmie was the undisputed champion, class F hydro pilot West of the Mississippi. In November of 1930, he set a world record of 49mph for class F outboard hydroplanes at the Salton Sea, California. (This was Jimmie’s last race). The afternoon ended all too quickly. Listening to Jimmie’s stories was much more interesting than working! But he & June had to be on their way home. They promised to come to Meadview again soon.

You may ask yourself, after seeing his picture here in the paper, “where have I seen this guy before?” You probably saw him on TV for just recently he made a television commercial for Timex Watch Corporation with John Cameron Swasye. Where was the commercial filmed? In a rapid on Colorado River, where else? (Badger Rapid, a real hum-dinger, located several miles below Lee’s Ferry).

I asked Jimmie about the watch that was strapped to the bow of the boat. He said that a cameraman reached in a box of about 15 watches and selected one at random. “It was a very expensive watch. They’re darn good watches.”

The Meadview crew wish to thank Jimmie and June for their time spent in coming to Meadview, for furnishing us a most pleasant afternoon and for all the exciting stories. “Many thanks and best wishes.”

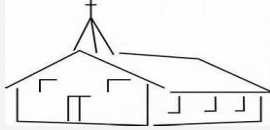
