Thank you for the opportunity to represent you and thank you for “your” continued support and confidence in us.

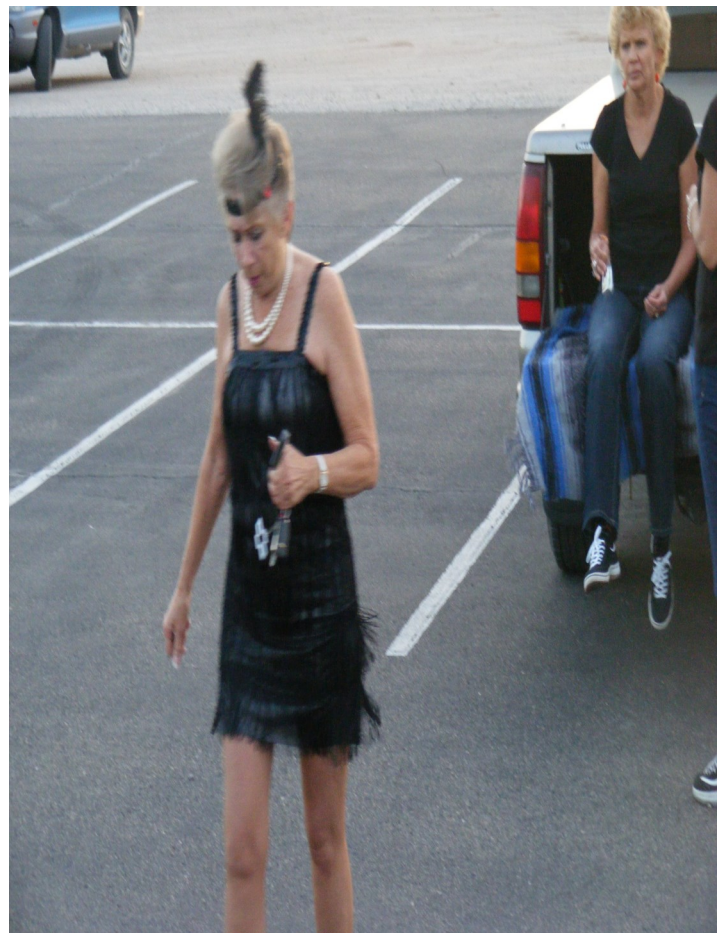

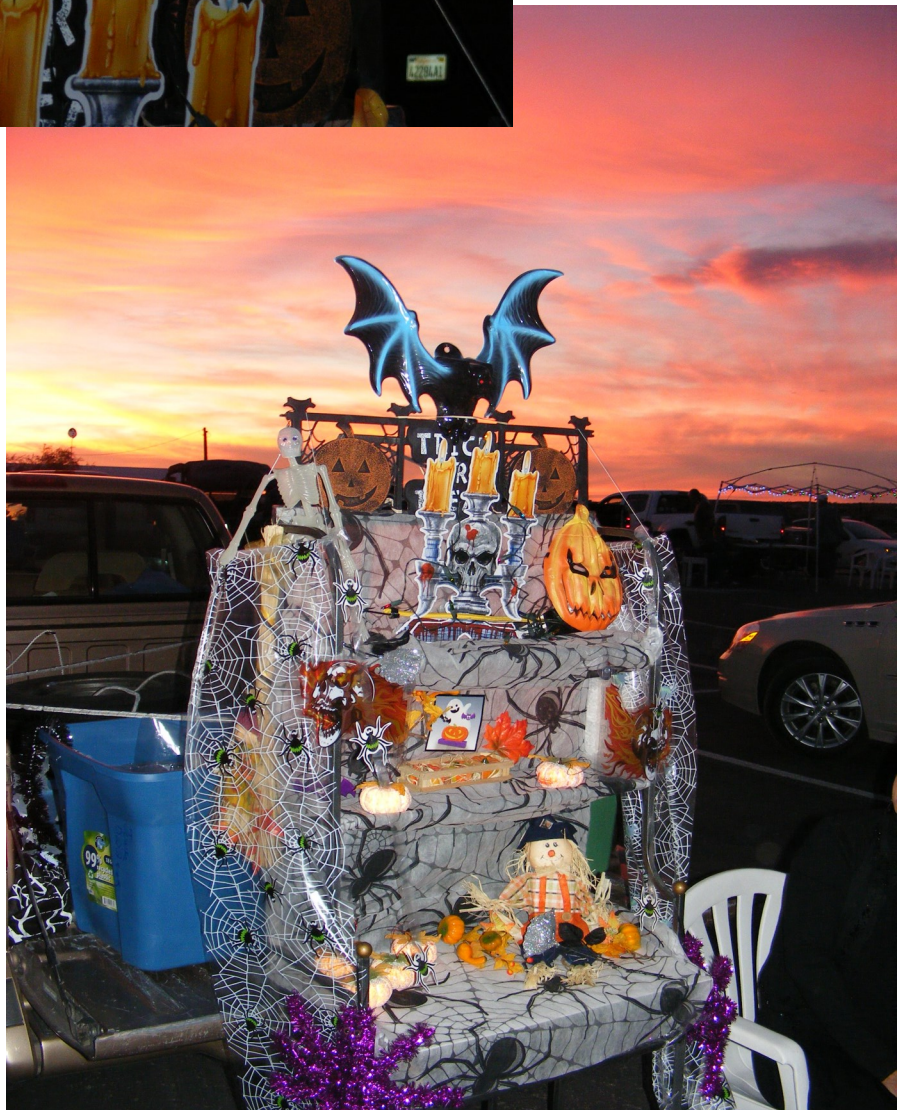

## Special Notice to ALL MCA Members Legal Notice of Election

### I. Candidate Eligibility:

A slate of candidates, all of whom are members in good standing of the Meadview Civic Association, shall be selected by a nominating committee. The consent of all candidates shall be obtained before placing their names on the ballot. At the annual meeting a member present may nominate a member for the Board of Governors. No write-in candidates shall be accepted unless nominated at the annual meeting. No member nominated at the annual meeting shall be considered unless the candidate consents to serve if elected. The presiding officer shall limit nominating speeches from the floor to one (1) minute each.

### II. Who May Vote:

Only members in good standing will be eligible to vote. To be a member in good standing means that all association assessments on lots being voted, have been paid in full by **2 P.M., THE FRIDAY PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING.**

### III. Voting Eligibility:

A person eligible to vote in this election must be the owner or co-owner of Meadview property which is presently being assessed by the Association.

One vote only may be cast for each lot so assessed. Where a lot or lots are owned by one or more persons, only one of the persons named as co-owner may vote for any one lot. Only one vote per lot is allowed.

You may vote by absentee ballot if unable to attend the meeting. You must request your absentee ballot from the Secretary of the Board. Carefully follow the instructions sent with your ballot(s) and return to the Secretary. **ABSENTEE BALLOTS MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE SECRETARY OF THE ASSOCIATION RECEIVED BY THE CLOSE OF THE LAST BUSINESS DAY PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING.**

### IV. Verification of Voting Eligibility:

Each prospective voter will be required to present proper identification prior to receiving the ballot(s) for voting. Association records will be checked to verify that such person is a member in good standing. Each prospective voter will then be given the specified number of ballots, one for each member lot, and will then cast his/her ballot(s) immediately after verification.

Voting hours shall be from the conclusion of the annual meeting to 2:00 p.m.

There shall be no electioneering within one hundred (100) yards of the polling place.

- V. Ballots for Voting:** Subsequent to verification of eligibility to vote, members will be given one (1) ballot for each lot for which he/she is authorized to cast a vote. Members, after verification of eligibility to vote, and receiving the ballot(s) shall proceed to vote and deposit said ballot(s) in the ballot box within ten (10) minutes. A member voting for more than ten (10) ballots shall have multiples of ten (10) minutes for each ten (10) ballots being voted.

### VI. Voting Procedures:

**A.** In accordance with the desires of the majority of the Association members as expressed at the May 28, 1988

meeting and at the prerogative of the present Board of Governors as authorized in Article III, Section I of the By-Laws of the Association, the number of persons to sit on the Board of Governors shall be seven (7).

**B.** Place an "X" in the box beside the name of each candidate you wish to vote for. On all propositions, place an "X" in the appropriate box. On all proposed By-Laws changes mark an "X" in the appropriate box.

**C.** Fold your ballot and deposit in the ballot box provided. NOTE: Voting for more candidates than seats available will invalidate the ballot.

### VII. Ballot Counting:

**A.** After all the ballots have been cast, the Election Committee will open the ballot box and proceed to count and record the votes.

**B.** To verify proper performance in all aspects of the election, the election will be monitored by appointed Association members.

### VIII. Installation of Officers:

**A.** Immediately after the determination of names of the winning candidates, the newly elected members will assume their positions on the Board.

**B.** In accordance with Article III of the Association By-Laws, the Board members will elect executive officers from their own ranks. The executive officers of the Association shall be President, Vice-President, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer.

**C.** This Board of Governors shall manage and control the business affairs of the Association in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Articles of Incorporation and the By-Laws of the Association.

### IX. Voting by Absentee Ballot:

Members can request an absentee ballot, one for each lot on which an assessment is paid, which will list the slate of candidate dates, Propositions, and the proposed By-Law changes. The request form for absentee ballots should be filled in and mailed to:

Upon receipt of the request form, eligibility and number of votes entitled to be cast will be determined. The ballot(s) will be mailed to the requester with a return envelope addressed to the Secretary of the Board. After indicating your choice of candidates and By-Law changes, seal the ballot(s) in the envelope addressed to the Secretary. Walk-in Absentee ballots will be accepted until, **2 P.M., THE FRIDAY PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING.** Absentee Ballots received after **THE FRIDAY PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING** mail pick-up, will be invalid.

Upon receipt the sealed envelope with the absentee ballot showing the Bar Code of the voter shall be logged in and placed in a locked ballot box. On election Day, the Election Committee will remove the ballot from the envelope for counting purposes.

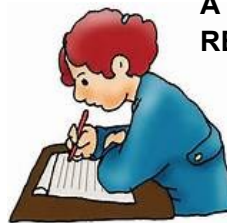

 MEADVIEW MARINA TO SPONSOR FISHING SCOREBOARD

Get ready for the dog-gondest fishing contest you've ever seen. Starting Thanksgiving weekend, the Meadview Marina is sponsoring the Meadview fishing scoreboard. What's it all about? Well, it's a six month fishing contest, ending on May 31<sup>st</sup>, 1967. But here's the fun part. Just about anyone with a little luck or a lot of skill can win, 'cause there are weekly prizes and monthly prizes as well as the overall scoreboard winners.

Here's how it works. In order to qualify your catch for the scoreboard, all you have to do is weigh in your fish at the Meadview Marina store and have your photo taken to verify the catch. One point will be awarded for each game fish weighing over 3 lbs., if it isn't a weekly or monthly winners. (Only one fish can be weighed per catch, and only one fish per day). This makes it fair for the local folks and visitors alike.

Each week a five dollar gift certificate will be awarded for the largest game fish caught regardless of species. Game fish qualifying for the scoreboard are bass, trout, crappie and catfish. The weekly contest starts on Sunday morning and ends 10:00 p.m. Saturday night.

Each month a \$10. 00 gift certificate will be awarded to the largest of EACH species of game fish logged on the scoreboard during the month. (That's a total of four monthly winners in addition to the individual weekly winners). The monthly contest ends at 10:00 p.m. on the third Saturday of each month and starts again the following Sunday morning.

The first overall scoreboard contest ends at 10:00 p.m., May 31<sup>st</sup>, 1967. The overall winner will receive a new 33 H.P. Evinrude electric start Ski-Twin outboard engine. Other beautiful prizes will be awarded to second, third, fourth and fifth place

winners.

Winners will be determined on the basis of overall points for the duration of the contest. Points will be awarded on the following basis.

One point will be awarded for each game fish weighed in over 3 pounds if it isn't a weekly or monthly winner.

Five points will be awarded to each weekly winner.

Ten points will be awarded to each monthly winner.

All points and awards are based on the largest fish by weight. Each month the weekly and monthly winners will have their picture in the Meadview Monitor and the total score for the month will be printed, together with current point standings of the leaders. Winners will be notified and receive their gift certificates by mail. The gift certificates are good for any item or items of your choice at the Meadview Marina, including sporting goods, groceries, gas, meals or just whatever you choose.

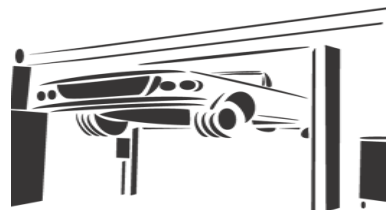

**THE NOV.** program introduced Deb Warren, Principle of Mt. Tipton Elementary School in Dolan. Ms. Warren provided many insights about what is going on in that school and what is planned. The STEM Fair (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) was a hands-on learning experience for each class with a variety of displays. Twenty-three children from our area attend Mt. Tipton. **SUPERVISOR JEAN** Bishop discussed the Town Hall meeting on Water that did provide a lot of information on the water basin in Hualapai Valley ( Red Lake). Bob Brady, former Fire Chief gave a list of reasons why all property owners in Lake Mead City and Meadview should be annexing their property into the fire district. In case of a home fire, the monetary savings would more than off set the tax cost. Annexation, now, has been simplified. If your property is on a public road, you can file a request to be annexed. Each request will be studied to be sure you are within a distance that the fire trucks could reach your home in time to save it. Call 564-2213 for a request form. **THE DEC.** program brought Todd Davison and Kevin Hardmann, Sheriff Deputies in charge of ERACE to present a power point on What, Why and How ERACE helps Mohave

County. If you see illegal dump sites, take a GPS, or get a street address or cross streets, or a milepost location and call the Sheriff's office to report the sighting. Dispatch will get your call to the Detective and/or the Investigator. They also reminded us that there are people out there who claim they will clean up your yard and haul your trash away. If you hire someone, get their name and license, ask for a receipt, and pay them half now, and half when they bring you a receipt from the landfill. **A NEW COM** Board was elected December. The following persons will hold the stated board seats. Suzann Newell- President, Karen Stacey-Program Chairman, Kayla Crowe - Secretary, Tom O'Keeffe- Treasurer, Cindy Kehoe and Carol Keller will be hosts, Adrienne O'Keeffe and Jonathan Kiser-COM NEWS; Anthony Carter, Carl Stacy and Jan Beckett will fill positions as needed. **THE JAN.** 8th COM program will be about Health Providers here in Meadview and the KRMC Hospice. **THE FEB.** will be about those early days in Gold Basin and Lost Basin. Our meetings are open to all, no dues, no sign up sheet and each meeting starts with cookies and coffee at 9:45 . The meetings are the 1st Thurs. of each month, except June, July and August.

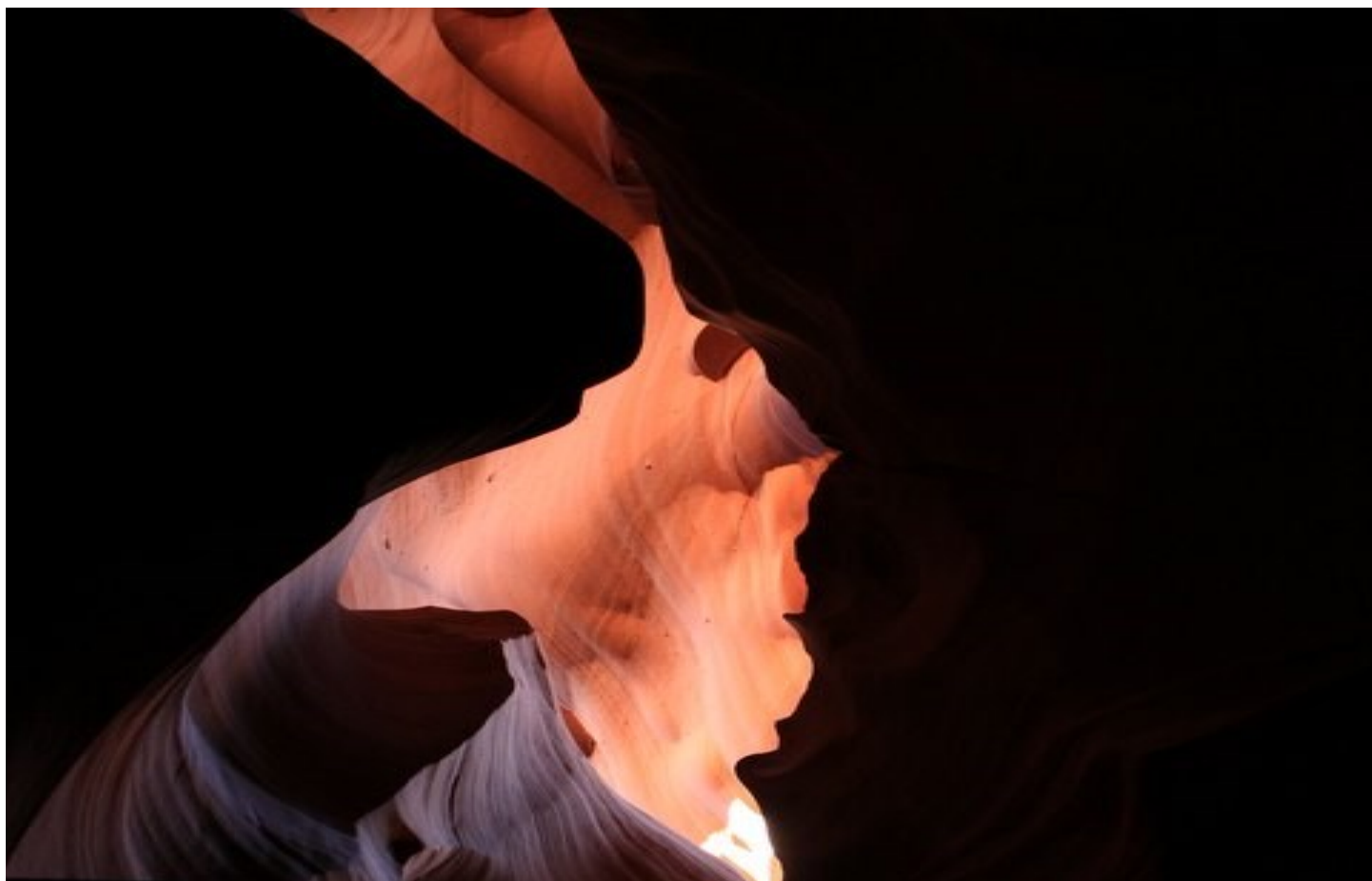

Fog settled down early in the morning on two of the trips, but lifted and the weather was perfect. Fifteen drove to Page to go with Navajo guides through Antelope Canyon. Nick Schmidt took some fantastic photos. Five hikers started up to the Castle, just below the Grand Wash Cliffs. Two made it to that interesting rock. Nine hiked up to Twin Springs in the Mt. Nutt Wilderness Area. The road to the Wilderness Area was the hard part. Vern Farris led a small group to some Indian Roasting Pits along the base of the Grand Wash Cliffs.

Seventeen huffed and puffed their way up Fox Canyon. It was a surprise to see the road washed out to a 5 foot drop off, and the wash had been widened with the flash floods that had rolled down the mountains. The house sized rocks were still in place but the slots between them were now filled with tree limbs, roots and gravel. This fairly easy hike became a really good test for our hiking skills.

Next, was the drive to the Meadview Outlook. That trail had been badly washed and the Stair Steps were now a conglomeration of rearranged boulders. Once on top two wash crossings became a bit of a problem, but daredevil drivers overcame the problems and we picnicked at the Overlook. Four jeeps and six quads made the drive down the Grapevines Wash and picnicked at the Rafters Ramp. Some hiked the trail to the Pearce Ferry Rapids which are still roaring and boiling. That trail is a good gentle path and the view at the end is surprising. Since it is close to home, take your visitors to see our rapids that eat boats.

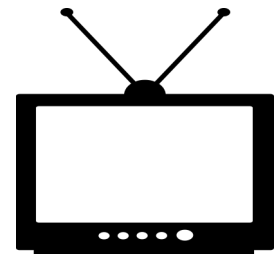
**LIBRARY NEWS**

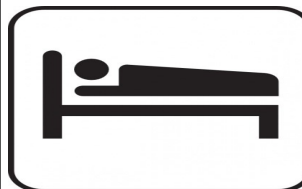

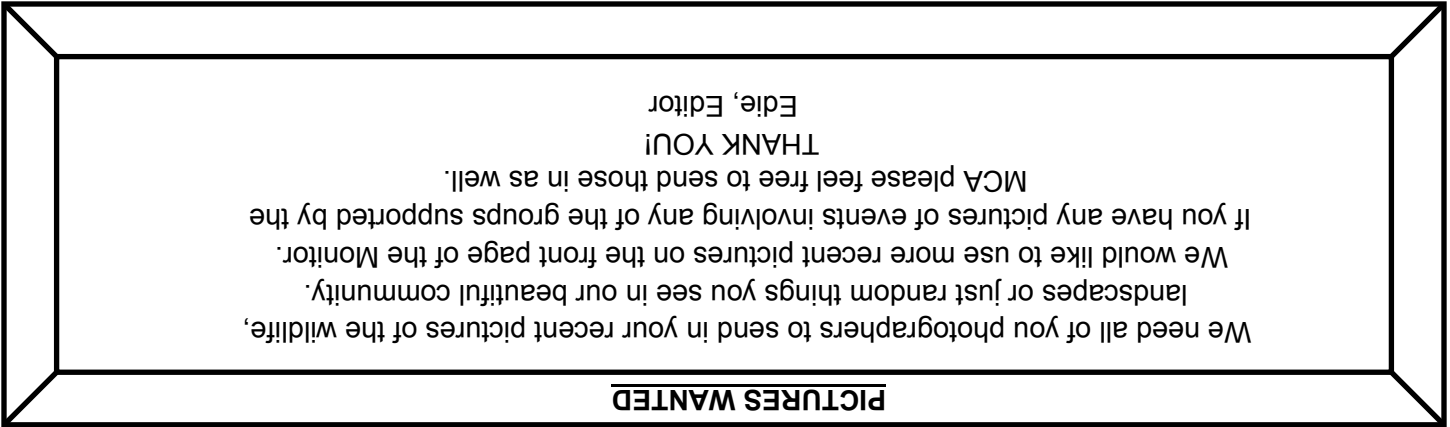
