



Blast from the Past

MEADVIEW TIME CAPSULES

FOR YOUR INFORMATION: There are two time capsules in and around Meadview and your club or group should be aware

of their placement, why they were placed and when they should be opened:

#1: On July 4th, 1976 the BI-CENTENNIAL of the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, the residents of Meadview, though few in number, built a monument that was dedicated to THE LOST BASIN MINERS of the MEADVIEW AREA, and inside of this rock monument they placed a time capsule which contained copies of the MCA MONITOR, letters and lists of residents, photos and probably a few items they felt would be of interest to current residents. The dedication ceremony with a Parade, Dancing, a barbecue and speeches were attended by the residents who dressed in costumes that portrayed the outfits of the Indians, miners, frontiersmen, pioneers and cowboys who had lived on Grapevine Mesa during the past 100 years. The Monument was presented to the Nation Park Service, with two Rangers accepting the gift. They did not state when the capsule should be opened, but if the Monument is ever destroyed, the capsule should be opened and the residents made aware of the items contained inside.

THE LOST BASIN MONUMENT is located in the Lake Overlook just past mile marker post 39, on the left side of Pierce Ferry Road. Vandals have removed some of the rocks in the front layer, but many visitors to the area stop and read the brass plaque that is on the monument. If this monument I ever torn down, the brass plaque should be presented to one of the permanent organizations (MCA comes to mind) to be displayed for the viewing with a story of why and who placed it. Involved in building the monument was Duane Johnson, Fred Wilson, Hank Wilson, and George Love with help from the NPS Rangers. Filling the time capsule were the wives and the other residents of Meadview in 1976.

#2: On May 12, 2012 with the dedication of the WELCOME sign, built and placed by the Meadview Area Chamber of Commerce, a time capsule was filled by members of the community and COM (Community Organizations of Meadview) using MCA MONITORS, photos, books detailing the history of Meadview, other books by local authors, a 2012 telephone book of Meadview residents and a list of those first Meadview residents down to 1986. Family members of those original residents were introduced. A flag salute was given by VFW members, the End of the Line Dancers did a short presentation and the Presidents of MACC and COM welcomed the crowd and dedicated the Welcome Sign. A luncheon was served at the MCA. The time capsule is under the large rock to the south of the sign.

It was decided that this time capsule was to be opened in twenty-five (25) years, making it 2037. Those items should be on display so the present residents and visitors can view them.

Since many of the residents of 2017 are not aware of either of these time capsules, we are giving this information to QUAIL, MCA, MACC, COM, AND VFW so someone will have the history and the knowledge of why the time capsules were placed

and when they should be opened.



Meadview Civic Association, Inc. The purpose of our organization is to foster & encourage the civic advancement of our members and/or property owners. However, Social Membership applications are also cogitated. In August of 1970, the owners of the Meadview subdivision determined that to maintain the friendly small town attraction of Meadview, a central meeting & recreational facility was needed. They set up the MCA with involuntary membership to property owners. A number of Meadview families agreed and the Articles of Incorporation were created and accepted by the State of Arizona. With an \$80,000 loan to erect the facility; construction of the lounge, kitchen and pool began January of 1971 and completed in July that same year.
