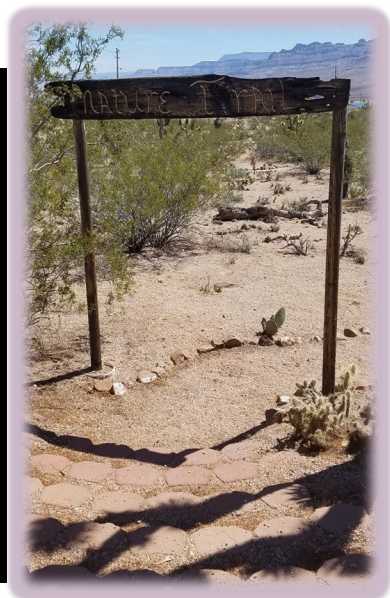

President's Letter to the Members


Welcome monsoons! Which means fall is not far behind. In September those organizations that have been on summer hiatus are back! MCA potlucks begin again! The sign-up sheet is in the MCA office. This event is for members and guests. Thank you to Rhonda Monroe our activities director for bringing back the potlucks on a quarterly basis. So far this summer we have had some major monsoon events! With the storms our pool at the MCA has been a continual challenge keeping it clean and the temperature and chemicals up to health department standards. On August 2nd the pool inspection passed with flying colors!! Thank you Fred for making sure all was in order and thank –you Michael for pitching in to help make the inspection go smoothly. What a team! During this wild weather occasionally when we have lightning and thunder, we will need to close the pool until the storm has passed. Please be aware that it is very dangerous to be in the pool when we are having thunder and lightning. Fred and Michael also maintain the entire facility including the landscaping and repairs.

We are so fortunate to have an exemplary staff at the MCA. Lydia and Julie in our office are dedicated and talented, it takes a great deal of time and effort to maintain the records of all our members, handle lien recordings, answering numerous questions, keep the financials in order along with helping the board do our jobs. Lydia and Julie are courteous and helpful. Security has been busy this summer, we have many more members using the pool, grounds, and facility. Bob, Woody, and Ron are happy to answer all questions regarding the facility and use of the grounds. You can be assured that the MCA is a comfortable and safe place to enjoy. We have had to replace the Air conditioner in the office, we now have a new split unit, which is more economical and will require less maintenance. We are continuing to investigate a generator for backup power in case of a long power outage in our community. The backup power generator will provide a place for our community to get out of the heat or cold, or if they need electricity to run oxygen tanks, a place to watch TV, play games, and fee at home during a potential power outage. The Architectural committee has had to issue several more complaints to property owners who are violation of our CCR'S. If you see a violation of the MCA CCR'S please file a complaint with the office. Many of these violations will also be against Mohave County Regulations. We follow up with the county if the violation is not corrected and is in violation of the county regulations as well. With the MCA Architectural committee working with the county, we are seeing improvements. Other projects on our agenda for this fall and upcoming year. Renovation of the Miniature Golf Course, Repairs to the horseshoe, shuffleboard courts, repairs to the pool tables, new couch in the lounge, and playground equipment and benches for the trail. We are looking forward to getting back together again. Remember the first COM is right around the corner. Don't forget the potluck, Quail meetings, Chamber of Commerce meetings, Bingo, and Line Dance will begin later this fall. And of course, don't forget Halloween Trunk or Treat. 

 - b. Open the QR code reader by tapping the  button at the top of the screen.
 - Avenza may ask to use your device's camera.
3. Scanning the QR code will open the Avenza Store in a web browser. Tap the "Get this Map Bundle" button.
4. Tap "Free," then "Install Now."

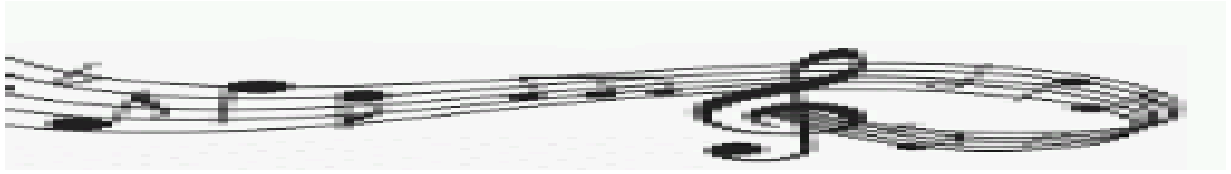

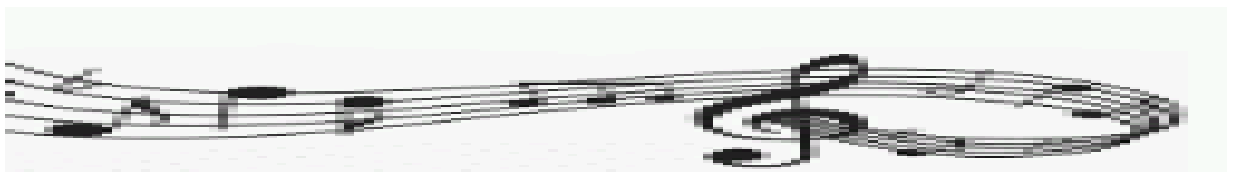

Meadview, a central meeting &

They set up the MCA with
involuntary membership to
property owners. A number of
Meadview families agreed and
the Articles of Incorporation
were created and accepted by
the State of Arizona. With an
\$80,000 loan to erect the
facility; construction of the
lounge, kitchen and pool began
January of 1971 and completed
in July that same year.
