



The first being the patio extension with three new picnic tables, one being wheelchair accessible, overhead fans, and BBQ grills. We have laid out an indoor Pickleball Court for our members to enjoy. At the edge of the Tennis Court we put up a practice backboard for the tennis enthusiasts; so that you can practice without the need of a partner. The outdoor shower in the pool area received an on-demand water heater. Lastly, we updated the swimming pool with a heat pump and solar cover. We feel the upgrades to the pool will help extended the time the pool will be used throughout the year. Hopefully, the pool season will start sooner and end later in the year.

Friends of the Arizona Joshua tree forest

We will be temporarily closing the kiosk trail due to resource damage from visitors walking off trail and hanging on Joshua Tree limbs. The trail will remain closed for several weeks until we complete a fence project along the trail. We will need volunteers to help with this project which will happen in late September to early October. Please call the Steffens at 928-564 -2373 if you are interested in volunteering.



We are also saddened to report that the US Fish and Wildlife Service published a notice indicating that it will not protect Joshua trees under the Endangered Species Act. The



request for protection as a threatened species was filed by Wild Earth Guardians in 2015. This news comes on the heels of the President's changes to the Endangered Species Act which includes preventing species from being listed based on threats from climate change. It has been well documented in several studies, including our study led by Todd Esque (USGS Research Ecologist), that Joshua Trees are being adversely affected by climate change.



Pierce Ferry Road Report By Pat Wright

Thanks to all who returned the "PETITION AND PROTEST" despite the lack of return address. If you have not as yet done so, please mail to M.C.A., P.O. Box 217, Meadview, AZ 86401. To date, we have had over 1,000 petitions returned. At a November special meeting with the Mohave County Government (Supervisors Wells, Bailey, Sterling, County Manager Anderson et al.) concerned citizens of Meadview and Dolan Springs received the usual non-answers to questions regarding road repair.

After being assured that Pierce Ferry Road repairs would commence shortly, (as in August, September, October, and November assurances), those attending left with the feeling that they had again risked life, limb and auto on the **"POTHOLE FREEWAY"** to no avail.

We all realize the financial problems of Mohave County, but fail to understand the failure of County government to try to obtain Federal and State financing for the project.

Questions regarding the Federal and State funding requirements are answered by vague generalities and no specifics.

An investigation committee is being formed to determine our next move in the **"POTHOLE PROJECT."** We will keep you informed of developments.

If you DO NOT have a PayPal Account – You may make a payment through PayPal using your Credit Card. However, there is a charge. When paying this way you will need to add that charge amount to the purchase amount.

ONLY SOME PROPERTIES ARE IN THE MCA

Residents of Meadview are reminded that not all properties in the Meadview area are MCA designated properties. Some properties were deliberately left out of the MCA because these subject Arizona properties that were being advertised in California somehow clashed with California law; therefore there are lots inside the MCA's sphere of influence with the same CC&R's as MCA lots, however, do not share the benefits of the MCA Membership and facilities. These particular lots were designated to have their own Home Owners Association.

The MCA Architectural Committee has through the years, and still is, worked to rid the Meadview area of dilapidated and unsafe dwellings that have been either abandoned or left neglected. The Board of Directors is elected to be a type of "watchman" over MCA business, not Mohave County. However, the MCA encourages all residents that if you know of unsafe or neglected properties, write a letter to the County of Mohave reporting these properties. If the properties are in violation, the County will perform. If you are having a difficult time legally classifying the property, ask the MCA Staff for help in identifying the property. The County will not reveal the name of the person sending in the complaint. We need to come together in cleaning up Meadview. As long as the abandoned, dilapidated properties remain Meadview will continue to attract vagrants and a criminal element, which will bring property values down and make Meadview an unsafe place to live or vacation.

MCA NOT A CLUB MED

The MCA's Board of Governors has requested members to fill out a "Recommendation & Suggestion" slip to help the Board of Governors better understand how they can serve the MCA Members. The slips can be found in the office and the entrance area of the auditorium. The Board thanks all of you who have taken the time to fill out these slips. Some of the slips requested the Board of Governors to form shuffle board leagues, weekly card games, bring in local music bands and have miniature golf tournaments. All excellent ideas except the part about the Board doing it! The Board of Governors has made available the setting for these recreational activities, but they truly have enough to do without facilitating a type of Club Med.
