The 50th Anniversary Party has been cancelled indefinitely, pending the availability of volunteers and the status of the virus.

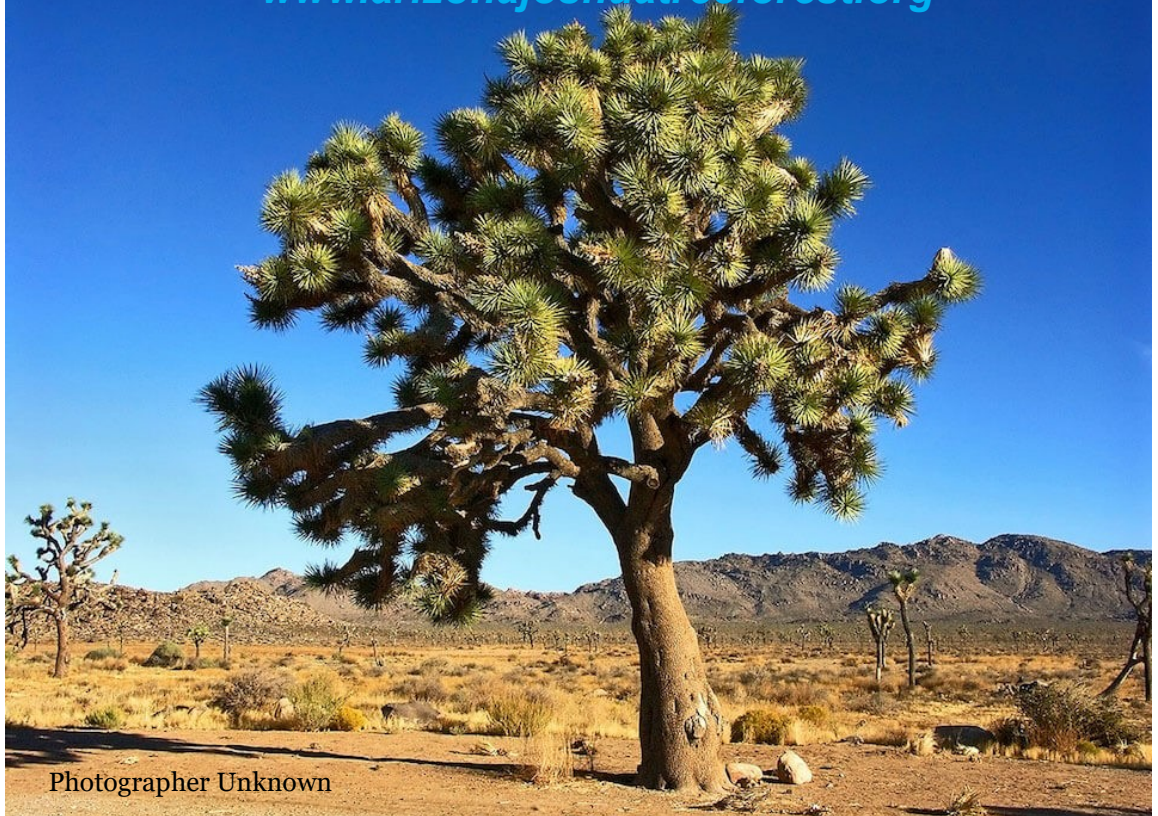
Everyone, stay safe and I hope you have a chance to enjoy the many amenities we have at the MCA.

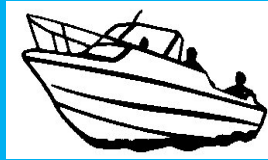

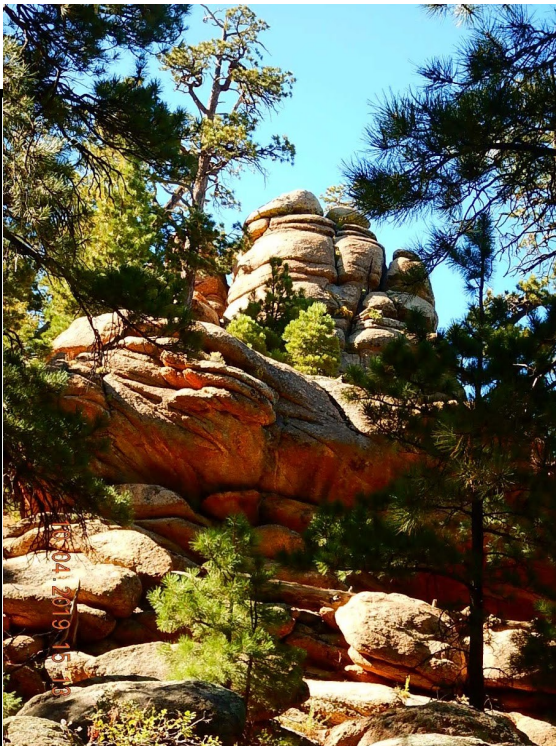

Meadview Hits National Media By Suzanne Newell

1984 HELICOPTER CRASH AND RESCUE

Sunday, July 29, 1984, the Reed family of Scottsdale, Richard and Linda and their two sons, Kevin 14, and Brian 12, left Boulder City to take a wonderous helicopter flight over the Grand Canyon and Lake Mead. Their pilot was David Bauer. David and his father ran a canyon tour service sometimes setting down on the landing strip above Pearce Ferry. Late that afternoon, when no word was received from David, Ken Bauer initiated a search using planes and helicopters. Nevada and Arizona law officers were alerted as were Federal officers including Park Rangers and the FAA.

Late the following day the wreckage was found near what locals refer to as "the steps" going to the Meadview over-look. The bodies of the pilot and the parents were found in the wreckage. Brian was found under a nearby tree, dazed and injured, barely conscious, but alive. The pilot who had spotted the wreck was a California friend of Ken Bauer's who flew in to help with the search and who flew one last grid before bad weather canceled the search that day.

Brian told rescuers that after pulling him from the wreck and making him as comfortable as possible his brother had gone for help heading for the scattered homes they had seen below the cliffs. Kevin had found rain water that had collected in rock depressions and he filled bottles found in a picnic basket. Leaving all but on of these bottles with his little brother, Kevin promised he'd bring back help.

Brian was flown into Valley Hospital in Las Vegas where surgery was performed on his many injuries.

Meanwhile, at the crash scene, darkness and bad weather arrived before a trail could be found so the search for Kevin had to wait until daylight. Deputy Sheriff Bob Windsheffel and National Park Service Ranger Don McBee drove

into the area and stayed the night.

The news media descended on Meadview; one helicopter landed on Meadview Blvd at Stillwater, and left the rotors going while the reporter rushed inside the store to use the phone; cameras clicked way; cars zoomed here and there. Reporters pushed and shoved to be first in line when each new fact was given by search personnel.

The bodies were removed the following morning after photos were taken of the site. Three TV helicopters arrived and national news programs were broadcast from the site. The story appeared in print, on radio and on TV, including pictures showing the copter at the wreckage site. The Joshua Tree that the tail rotor hit had toppled across the flipped copter, effectively hiding it from view.

July 31, two days after the wreck, Rod Honberger arrived to begin construction work on a building at 250 Pueblo Drive (Now housing the Meadview Library). It was quite early when he saw a young boy drinking water from a hose in back of the building. On closer inspection Rod realized the boy was Kevin. The 14 year old was hazed and exhausted, bloody scratches and scrapes covered his face, legs and arms. One arm was badly swollen. He was clutching a green bottled filled with dirty water. His cut off jean shorts were torn and his tennis shoes shredded. Later inspection found that the backside of the shorts had been ripped and torn as he struggled down the face of the Grand Wash Cliffs.

Kevin had found the only spot for miles and miles where help was available.

Rod put the boy in his truck and took him to the MCA where Bob Watkins, then manager of Meadview Co., alerted the sheriff's department and then called Ken Bauer in Boulder City. Emergency service personnel were called and three arrived within minutes. The blood on Kevin's face and arms were from minor cuts and scrapes. The swollen

wrist needed a doctor's attention. He was hungry so Rod went to the Market where he bought burritos and a soda.

Kevin credited his Boy Scout training for his ability to walk across the plateau and climb down the cliffs. He told Bert Buck he had slept the first night on the rim, the next day he climbed down the cliffs. That night he slept in a hollow he scooped out of sand in a wash.

Bauer's helicopter arrived 20 minutes later. Kevin welcomed the knowledge that his brother had been found and was doing well in the hospital. With some hesitancy he climbed aboard the helicopter to join Brian in Vegas. The residents of Meadview that had contact with Kevin felt he showed a lot of strength of character and determination to set off into an unknown territory to find help for his brother.

Hordes of journalists, including TV crews, arrived in Meadview wanting to interview the Meadview residents who had cared for Kevin, but the three emergency service people had blended into the background as had the others. Rod recounts that the CBS crew from Phoenix came into the Crow's Nest and since he was sitting there he agreed with the waitress when she told them, "Rod left town this morning."

In a sidebar to this story: Rod Honberger's wife Donna, and the dead pilot David Bauer, had been classmates in high school; Donna's father and Ken Bauer were friends; Bob Watkins and Meadview Co. had used the flight service many times.

Thanks to Bert Buck, Rod Honberger, Bob Watkins, Don McBee and others for taking the time to retell this story. For on dramatic moment Meadview appeared in the klieg lights of the national media. Those who witnessed the descending horde weren't overly impressed and were very happy to have calm and quiet return to Meadview.

The purpose of our organization is to foster & encourage the civic advancement of our members and/or property owners. However, Social Membership applications are also considered. In August of 1970, the owners of the Meadview subdivision determined that to maintain the friendly small town attraction of Meadview, a central meeting & recreational facility was needed. They set up the MCA with involuntary membership to property owners. A number of Meadview families agreed and the Articles of Incorporation were created and accepted by the State of Arizona. With an \$80,000 loan to erect the facility, construction of the lounge, kitchen and pool began January of 1971 and completed in July that same year.
