MAIL DELIVERY TO GRAPEVINE MESA

In 1855 a post office was opened in the Mormon settlement of Bringhurst (which is now Las Vegas) and young boys 12 to 14 years old got subscriptions from the scattered residents north to the mining town of Pioche, NV, over to the town of St. Thomas (now known as the Lost City south of Overton), down to Rioville and Bonelli's Landing, across the Colorado River down to the El Dorado Canyon mining area and the mining town of Nelson NV, then east to Chloride with a stop at the Pony Express station at Grass Springs (Diamond Bar Ranch). This trip was 229 miles one way and was done on horseback three times a week. The youngest rider was 12 but sometimes his 10 year old brother would ride part of the route. This so called Star Route lasted for only two years.

The mining district of Lost Basin opened a post office on July 11, 1882. Mike Scanlon, who ran the Scanlon Ferry and was involved with various mines in the area, was responsible for bringing this Lost Basin Post Office into being. The building can still be seen off BLM route 142 (it now sits on the Mojave Drums land). This is a small rock building, which once had turquoise and mica rocks visible in the construction. George and Loretta Beach, owners of Mojave Drums, have approached BLM or a state Historical Society to recognize this as a historical site. The post office is located six miles west of Patterson's Well, seven miles east of the Hualapai Wash and was the earliest post office in the Gold Basin-Lost Basin area.

In September 1890 Scanlon started a post office in Gold Basin for the ranchers and miners in that area. It closed on January 1, 1894 then opened again in March 1904 only to close one final time in June of 1907.

The early permanent residents of Meadview, in 1966/67, drove to Dolan to get their mail. In 1973 Bob and Marianne Huffer applied for a postal contract to set up in their new building that would become the Meadview Market. After months of waiting and finally with help by our Representative Bob Stump, the application was approved in December of 1977. (Apparently the application had been approved in 1973, but it was lost between Kingman and Flagstaff. Probably lost in the mail!!). During that time Bob requested boxes for the wall he had set aside for the post office, but P.O. department had none for Meadview so Bob scrounged up the boxes needed from a dump in Cottonwood, AZ. The first Meadview post office opened on June 2, 1978 with mail delivered three times a week. A wall held the boxes and a window was opened where letters and packages could be mailed and stamps purchased. Meadview got a zip code in January 1979 after much effort from Fred Wilson and Glen Smith.

In the 80's the market owners, Jerry and Lillian Simmerman, began five day mail delivery, still in that small area of the market and UPS would deliver packages to the store. At Christmas time the entire front section of the store would be piled high with boxes and the residents had to sort through them each day hunting for anything that had their name on it. In 1991 residents insisted that house address numbers be assigned by the county so UPS could deliver packages to the home address. In 1994 Gary Wiens, owner of the Meadview Market, remodeled the small storage building east of the market to remove the post office from inside the market. Residents rejoiced to have a real post office with a flag flying above the door. In 2005 the post office started having Saturday hours. When Tracy and Trent Von Wormer, became owners of the Meadview Market they realized the post office needed to expand. Residents were anxious to see the post office move into the back of the new hardware store with many new boxes available for use, real cooling and heating and the roof didn't leak!

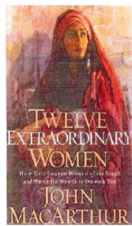

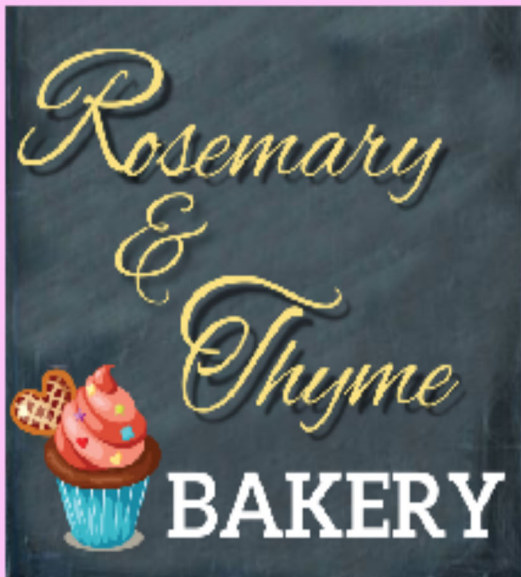

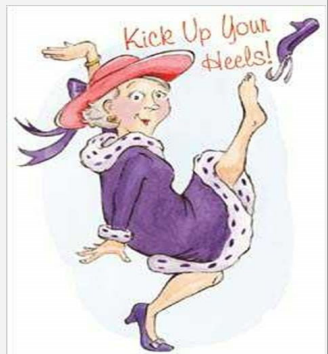


We will start planning to attend the Red Hat Fashion Show to take place on November 6th at the Riverside Casino in Laughlin.

*In August of 1970, the owners of
the Meadview subdivision
determined that to maintain the
friendly small town attraction
of Meadview, a central meeting
& recreational facility was

accepted by the State of
Arizona. With an \$80,000 loan
