PRESIDENT’S LETTER TO THE MEMBERS

Here we are in August already, it has been a hot summer in Meadview and many of our members have enjoyed the use of the MCA pool. We are looking forward to some changes in the pool area, as you know we ask that anyone entering the pool, use the outdoor shower first. Some of our members have requested warm water at the shower so we will be installing a tankless hot water heater, the warm water will not only make the shower more comfortable but should encourage more people to use it.

We are also looking into adding a heat pump to work in conjunction with the solar system, so we can extend the pool use season.

The extension for the patio, just outside the auditorium, should be started soon. Getting permits for this project has been a time consuming process and has caused many delays. When the extension is completed it will add more picnic tables in a covered area and several permanently mounted charcoal grills. It should be an ideal area for an afternoon family cook out. We are looking forward to completing this project and will give you more information in future Monitors.

The new 7 member board is in place and working hard to make the MCA a go to place when you are in Meadview. There are a few things that you should keep in mind when visiting the MCA. The MCA is a private property owners organization and only members in good standing are allowed to use the facilities via their key card. You are not allowed to lend your card to anyone else nor are children under the age of 18 allowed to use the facility without an adult member present. You are allowed to bring guests from out of town but remember adults who live in the Meadview area who are not members can apply for a social membership and can not be brought in as guests. BLAST FROM THE PAST

“POT HOLES ARE IN BLOOM!” *Meadview Monitor, Issue May-June 1979*

Mohave County Supervisor Ray Wells made a statement at a recent Nutrition Program meeting in Dolan Springs, saying, “I’m on my way to Meadview right now - I can assure you we (presumably Mohave County) are going to pave the Pierce Ferry Road all the way to Meadview - even if it takes a million dollars- .”

Meadview residents had been told of Wells’ presence in Dolan Springs, and his intention to meet with residents on Meadview. Fortunately, they did not hold their breath while they waited - Wells did not arrive in Meadview!!

Wells’ Million Dollar Road story was checked out with Mohave County Road Superintendent Virgil Hartup who was unaware of Wells’ latest statement. Hartup reported the county was processing material at Dolan Springs for a bituminous overlay of the first 10 miles of Pierce Ferry Road, beginning at U.S. Hwy. 93.

Hartup was asked about Wells’ frequent statements to Meadview land owners which included a promise that the roadbed would be a 7-inch compacted road - (which would make the Pierce Ferry Road the best road in the nation). Hartup said he was unaware of Wells’ latest promise.

The 10-mile road project, said to be under construction, is not the promise issue of concern. The REAL problem lies in the fact that absolutely no comprehensive plans (or promises) have been submitted to the property owners who depend upon the 28 miles of deteriorated road beyond the 10-mile proposed road project.

The excuse offered by Mohave County for **loaning** \$365,000 to Yuma County (funds originally allocated for reconstruction of the Pierce Ferry Road) was attributed to the lack of federally required right-of-ways in certain areas where the road had been realigned since 1960.

Aix months ago, at a meeting attended by property owners from Dolan Springs and Meadview, Ed DeLong asked Supervisor Ray Wells, “if right-of-ways are an obstacle, let us have a list — and we (interested property owners) will try to help get the right-of-ways.”

At press time, the maps and list of the properties involved are now available. Six months later!

Apparently the three affected communities have been handed a “DO IT YOURSELF KIT” - which may be the only way to keep the project going until 1980. In the meantime, **SPRING IS HERE— and the POT HOLES ARE IN BLOOM!**

FRIENDS OF THE ARIZONA JOSHUA TREE FOREST

Communities like Meadview which are close to public lands, such as our magnificent Joshua Tree Forest, tend to be more stable economically due to tourism and healthier due to access to open spaces. Meadview is one of the few unincorporated communities in the country that is within a National Park (Lake Mead National Recreation Area).

Our unique Joshua Tree Forest has two official designations. In 1967, five sections (3200 acres) of the very best stand of Joshua trees was designated as a National Natural Landmark (NNL). This designation is a recommendation to encourage the conservation of the best examples of unique biological and geological features in the U.S. Our NNL designated area is the densest part of the forest on the Grapevine Mesa mainly south of

Diamond Bar Rd. and just east of Pierce Ferry Rd.

The largest part of our Joshua Tree Forest was designated as an Area of Critical Environmental Concern (ACEC) in 1993. This area surrounds the NNL sections and extends north to Meadview from the east side of Pierce Ferry Rd and along the base of the Grand Wash cliffs. An ACEC highlights areas where special management attention is needed to protect important historical, cultural and scenic values as well as fish and wildlife or other natural resources.

Join us in our efforts to protect and preserve our beautiful Joshua Tree Forest!

In August of 1970, the owners of the Meadview subdivision determined that to maintain the friendly small town attraction of Meadview, a central meeting & recreational facility was needed. They set up the MCA with involuntary membership to property owners. A number of Meadview families agreed and the Articles of Incorporation were created and accepted by the State of Arizona. With an \$80,000 loan to erect the facility; construction of the lounge, kitchen and pool began January of 1971 and completed in July that same year.
